Household Hazardous Waste Day Update

This year's event will be held on Saturday September 23rd from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Putnam County Fairgrounds next to the north grandstands, traffic flow needs to come from the Jefferson Ave. entrance across from Wal-Mart.

Items that **will** be accepted at the event: Household cleaners, Automotive products, Home improvement & Maintenance products, Lawn & Garden products, Electronics, and Misc. items such as polish removers, pool chemicals, photo processing chemicals, fluorescent bulbs, prescription medication (labeled) elemental mercury (thermometers etc.)

Items that will **NOT** be accepted: Medical waste, explosives & ordinances, radioactive compounds, laundry soap & non-pesticidal shampoo, over-the-counter medicines, friable asbestos, commercial farm pesticides, unidentified powder, machine parts/compressors containing oil or Freon, dead appliances and incandescent light bulbs, vegetable oil, dried paint cans or dried up latex paint, auto parts, cement mix, lime, bone meal, grout, empty gas cylinders, home-made canned food or wine, Di-pel (organic pesticide)

Recycling Center Stats: Putnam Co. Solid Waste Director Keith Street provided the following statistics for publication. Household garbage costs \$29/ton to dispose of, we generate on average 152 tons of garbage daily, which comes to \$132,240/month of costs to Putnam Co. Recycling brought revenue to the county in the average amount of \$52,248/ month. The highest revenue maker for the county is cardboard with office paper coming in second. The citizens of Putnam Co. do a great job with recycling, however to bring those costs down even more we all can do much more.
